Remarks:

Jentsch's arrangement omits some measures of Schubert's setting and freely rearranges the chords to achieve an easy and playable guitar part. I have made a few small corrections, but have not restored the missing measures.

I have also changed existing dynamic markings and added others. The only dynamic markings both in Schubert and Jentsch are a "p" at the beginning of bar 1 and a "pp" at the beginning of bar 3.
